Daughters

Many liberal Jews do not announce the gender of their child, until the actual naming ceremony, lest people decide not to attend the naming ceremony of a baby girl, because it is not seen as important as a bris (the circumcision ceremony). If anything, I feel it's the bris should be done in private (if one chooses to do one at all), since no one should take pleasure in a baby's pain. To begin to rectify this deep imbalance between ceremonies, which exists even in liberal communities, I've begun to compose liturgy specifically celebrating the birth of girls. This Amihai-like poem questions why girls are never born and named in the Bible:

The Disappearance of Women

נשים נעלמות

In the Torah, Men are born
Women, however, appear, like God
From Nowhere
Jacob had a daughter
But she disappeared silently
One day all women shall leave,
And then what will happen to the Torah?
